


Q1 Please check your learner's grade level for the upcoming 2020-21 school year. Check all that apply.



There is also not enough time in the school day to accommodate effective cleanliness efforts such as sanitizing classrooms and workspaces multiple times a day. Even having a set number of learners in the building at a particular time and alternating certain days for certain classes, etc does not lower the risk for the teachers and staff each student will come in contact with as each teacher will interact with each student at some point during the week. I'm also concerned about general hygiene. Children are not responsible enough to wash hands appropriately, use Kleenex for nose blowing and hand sanitizer in between during typical cold/flu season, more less during an actual pandemic. Without having a vaccine in place at this time I am just very uncomfortable with students and staff being in close proximity and question the effectiveness of teaching and learning that will take place as various restraints are attempting to be adhered to. Classroom management is no small feat in general. As an educator myself, I foresee kids being kids- quite playful. I see masks being thrown about, random coughing on one another or touching one another's materials because it's funny, etc. Even the most responsible child is still only developmentally able(and should only be held accountable) to handle what is appropriate for his/her age group. Younger children aren't even aware of personal space at all and are often unpredictable and uncontrollable. Older children often know the rules but are unable to abide by them. It is our job as adults to make the right decisions, often the hard decisions, to keep our children safe so that they might grow up and become the leaders we desire them to be. There is just not enough data to fully understand the effect of the Coronavirus on children. At the height of the virus we immediately removed our learners from school so we did have a chance to see what might occur. While It's been said that children are not really getting sick, it's also been proven that children are more likely to be asymptotic and still be carriers for the virus. primarily minority students who tend to have parents in the household who are essential workers. These parents will continually be in contact with the general public which puts their children at risk of putting their classmates at risk as well. Let's also keep in mind the data that's been noted regarding minority populations and the increased death rate from COVID 19 due to individuals having prior health issues and being unable to combat the virus. I am concerned about our learners, their families, and of course our teachers , staff and the safety of their families.




